

# **History of Community Hospitals**



1859 1 Cottage Hospital in Cranleigh 1890 240 Cottage Hospitals

- ✓ A Safe and Clean Environment
- ✓ A Facility where family doctors could work with nurses and have support from hospital doctors

# Research Evidence on Community Hospitals

#### **Patient Outcomes**

"Care in Community Hospitals was consistent with greater independence"

"Effects of locality based community hospital care on independence in older people needing rehabilitation: randomised controlled trial."

Green et al. 2005 Br Med J 331(7512):317-322.

#### **Cost Effectiveness**

"The Community Hospital is cost effective for post-acute in-patient rehabilitation"

"Post-acute care for older people in community hospitals--a cost-effectiveness analysis within a multi-centre randomised controlled trial." O'Reilly et al 2008 Age and Ageing 37(5):513-520.

#### **Patient Views**

"The Community Hospital service was welcomed by patients"

"The patient experience of community hospital - the process of care as a determinant of satisfaction." Small et al. 2007 Journal of Evaluation in Clinical Practice: 95-101.

#### **Intermediate Care - Norway**

"Intermediate care is highly effective"

"Intermediate care at a community hospital as an alternative to prolonged general hospital care for elderly patients: a randomised controlled trial." Garasen et al. 2007 BMC Public Health 7:68.

#### **GP Hospital Impact - Netherlands**

"The community hospital is a valuable alternative to care at home, nursing home or general hospital, particularly for older people who have a poor quality of life related to their health conditions and who require short term care"

## **Role of Community Hospitals in Italy**

"Community hospitals could play a relevant role as providers of intermediate care at a relatively low cost."

## **National Picture is Mixed**

Strategy	Examples

Investment & Efficiency	Gloucestershire Cumbria Oxfordshire Derbyshire
Reductions or Closures – Service Transformation to New Models	Staffordshire (ie. Longton Hospital) Surrey (i.e. Leatherhead, Molesley) Suffolk (i.e. Southwold, Halesworth) Devon (i.e. Axminster, Torrington)

## **Some Context for Crediton Hospital**

- Devon Strategy is that not all Community Hospitals will have inpatient beds
- Nursing staff shortages prompting centralisation of inpatient services
- Financial savings required
- Ideas for "Community Hospitals without beds" to develop as a focus for community health and care resources
