BONIFACE TRAIL PUBLIC CONSULTATION





As mentioned in the previous newsletter, there has been a long-term desire to achieve a safe cycle/pedestrian path from Crediton to Exeter, one that doesn't use existing highway (A377 or otherwise), to serve as a safe and environmentally-friendly way of accessing Crediton, Exeter and everywhere in between! The number of passengers using Crediton Railway Station has more than doubled in recent years and alongside the volume of traffic/congestion issues on the A377, this has proved just how high the demand for travel is between Crediton and Exeter. Currently, there is no continuous path to provide a safe walking, wheeling or cycling link between the two.

As part of the consultation, there are currently 2 proposed alignments: the A377 alignment and the Quiet Lanes Alignment. For full details, including the route alignment options, please visit devon.cc/boniface-trail. This webpage also provides details on the ways in which you can provide feedback on the proposed alignments and which you may prefer.
