NEW YEAR MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

The year ended with Christmas lights shining in the darkness all along the length of our town. It was a pleasure to welcome so many people to the square at the end of November to see them switched on, then illuminating the bustle in the High Street and carols in the square in December and still brightening the buildings until twelfth night in January.

In the rather gloomy days that follow, when the lights are back in their boxes and warm spring sunshine seems a long way off, it can feel as if there's nothing much going on and nothing to look forward to. But behind the scenes things are happening. The town council is working with other organisations on events and opportunities in 2024 for people of all ages in Crediton, including D-Day 80th Anniversary commemorations, the summer Food Festival and St Boniface Day celebrations.

It's important that we work with our district council, too, to make the most of any investment that comes our way. We will continue discussions with them on projects that benefit the town. We are publicising the consultation on the district council's Crediton Masterplan in January (see back page) and will be keen to hear your views. We are committed to ensuring that Newcombes Meadow continues to have a paddling pool, currently maintained by the district, and easily accessible toilets while making best use of existing facilities.

Over the years, the town council has gradually added to the formally planted floral decorations around the town. Quite a lot of these are now being planted and maintained by volunteers. Other small pockets of land have been taken on by community groups, some recently, some several years ago, transforming previously unloved corners into colourful, blooming patches buzzing with life. Many of them entered the RHS It's Your Neighbourhood competition (see page 3) and were highly scored. They really do make a huge difference to our neighbourhoods. We are grateful for all their work and look forward to being impressed again as the seasons change.

There will be a lot to do in 2024 so look out for events and projects around town. Meanwhile, I send everyone living, visiting and working in Crediton my very best wishes for the New Year.

COMMUNITY BUDGETING WORKSHOPS SUMMARY

Thank you to those of you who attended our Community Budget Workshops held throughout November. Whilst the number of attendees was low, we appreciated the opportunity to present our budget requirements and what we spend money on and why, and to chat about various other issues affecting Crediton.

In these times of financial challenges and ever-increasing pressure on local authority budgets, tough choices must and are being made. It is more crucial than ever to work collaboratively with Mid Devon District Council and Devon County Council where possible, to ensure that our community's needs are met, and that our shared resources are allocated wisely and effectively. It is important to remember that town and parish councils are not subject to the same limitations when increasing their council tax requirement. Town/parish councils, as a whole, are finding that they are taking on additional services that were once delivered by other tiers of local authority in order to safeguard them.

The workshops centred around how we spend our budget, what services we deliver to Crediton and what services people think are important. We asked those present to use radar graphs to plot the importance of each service, and the average findings can be seen below (a mark of '0' represents no importance and '6' is high importance).

Property and Assets - This graph relates to the delivery of services we already provide relating to buildings and areas the town council owns (Old Landscore School, Peoples Park, Upper Deck & the provision of CCTV).

Community - This graph relates to the provision of services we provide to our community which enhance the lives of those who live here.

New Services - This graph relates to the possible reduction of services delivered by Mid Devon District Council. They have advised that these service areas are likely to be reduced or removed and could be passed to the town council for future provision.

Crediton Town Council will use the findings from the Community Budgeting Workshops to inform the setting of the 2024/25 budget and precept. A decision on the level of precept required will be made at its Full Council meeting on Tuesday 16 January 2024.
