St Boniface Statue Update

As most of you will be aware, we received sad news in May that the St Boniface Statue in Newcombes Meadow had been vandalised with graffiti. Since then, we have been working hard to get the graffiti removed as guickly as possible.

I'm sure many of you may have been wondering why the writing was not removed immediately but unfortunately, due to the delicate Portland stone, it quickly became clear to us that this was going to be big job. After receiving advice from local stonemasons, F J Stevens & Sons, we were able to track down the specialist cleaning system needed to successfully remove the paint. So, we are pleased to confirm the Statue will soon be restored to its former glory for everyone to enjoy, with the clean scheduled for Thursday, 9th July 2020.

Due to current restrictions, we were unsure whether we would be able to decorate the town with the usual floral displays, but, we have to say huge thank you to Somerset West & Taunton and Jordan Hewitt for making it happen. Share in the Square


From the first week of July until September, look out for *Share in the Square,* a new Town Team project, supported by the town and district councils.

Twelve well-spaced picnic tables with benches and parasols will be in the Town Square for people to sit at, meet friends or take a break, completely free of charge. Anyone can use them, and they're large enough to allow 2 metres distance between people. The food and drink businesses around the square are supporting *Share in the Square*. It's not necessary to buy refreshments in order to sit at the tables – though if you fancy a take-out drink or snack, please do! Volunteers will be on hand to clean the tables regularly and to help ensure social distancing.

Later in the month, some socially distanced entertainment and community activities will be included in *Share in the Square*.
